#### **Fundraisers**

# Purdy's

- Total sales \$1989.50 –\$562.04 profit. Not large margins. We had 32 orders. Next year maybe look at World's Finest. Case of 30. We had organized it pre-Covid.
- Prize for student who sold the most Student sold \$440.00. Council agrees to give this family a \$25.00 gift card to Starbucks.

# **Memory Album Book**

- 35 have been purchased for Open House, at \$10.00 each and will sell for \$30.00.
- Will sell at Welcome to Kindergarten and replenish that stock at that point. There are currently 12 registrations for JK 2023. L. Choporis will send an email reminder.

#### **Catholic Education Week**

• Tentative plan – Thursday, May 4 - welcome community in. "We are Many, We are One" theme, art gallery with self portraits. Gym will have class art display related to theme. Will be set up art gallery style, buy cookies for all kids, serve hot chocolate, try to sell cookies and hot chocolate to interested parents to raise money for Sharelife. Looking for volunteers. Will boil kettles instead of doing pots of boiling water. Start at 11:30HRS for boiling. Classes will come down 1 or 2 at a time within a specific time slot so parents will be advised of that time if they want to come then. \$6 for 100 cups at No Frills, require 500 cups. Will serve in the gym as we did last time. Council agrees with parents paying to raise money for Sharelife for cookies and hot chocolate, and students in the school will receive complimentary.

# **Playdate**

- **Tentatively** June 16<sup>th</sup> and June 19<sup>th</sup> is a rain day. June 21<sup>st</sup> is grad. Staff got materials last year, grade 7s were leaders and grade 8 put games on. Staff agreed to help. Last year council paid for hot dogs. In the council funds there \$4949 currently, and giving \$1000 to grad. Some teachers have not used their teacher allocated funds yet. Last year hot dog vendor charged us \$2034 for everything. He charged us \$5.00 a child approximately. We will look more into the pricing to see if the price has changed, have students potentially pay.
- Ice Cream Sandwiches \$9.99 for 24 at No Frills, School Generated will pay for those or hot dogs depending on price.

# **Freezie Friday**

- In June, sell large freezies \$1.00 a piece and sell smaller for \$.25 for small size.
- Depending on price council can buy all the ice cream and the freezies for the Fridays because will generate money back.
