Fundraisers

Faith

- Virtue recognition continues monthly. Dates will be in monthly newsletter and held at end of month.
- Remembrance Day Liturgy on November 11th at 10:40am
- Youth Faith Ambassadors have resumed. We have booked a visit to Dr. Simone's warehouse in February
- Thanksgiving food drive was extremely successful. Approximately 10 large boxes of food to the Knights Table.
- Rosary of Apostolate visit started in October and will be visiting in-person each month.
- Advent Mass at SJB Dec. 13th at 11:00am
- Confessions will be held at the school on January 9th for grades 3-8
- X-Movement has been booked and will be in the school the week of December 5th
- Pastoral Plan for the school will be shared on School website in December

Curriculum Items

- Our School Improvement Team will continue to work with school staff to support our collaborative inquiry with a focus on Math and Well-Being
- Progress Reports go home on November 15th and interviews are on November 17th
- Aquinas has been visiting with our Grade 8 students
- Continued emphasis on Mathematics provincially
- EQAO Results will be shared shortly with the community. Overall, math is a concern provincially and within our Board and school.
- We will be receiving an 8 week block form Literacy Lead teachers in the upcoming months. They will be focusing on instructional support for our primary grades.
- In-school and after-school tutoring supports- Through Ministry funding, we have extra support for literacy and math for students who are near provincial standards. This is ongoing until December.
- Treaties Week- celebrated November 7-11th. Celebrated with daily announcements, school wide, videos. Thank you to Mlle. Moreira, Mme. Franco and their students for putting this altogether

School Generated Funds:

- Plan submitted yearly. Includes supporting graduation costs, presenters, technology purchases, school yard enhancements, Charitable donations, liturgical activities, athletics, and curriculum support.
- Plans for pizza and milk days for fundraising
- Carry forward of approx. \$6400.

Extra-Curricular

- Halloween Dance was very successful and fun for all. We are thankful to the Intermediate students and teachers who sponsored the dance.
- Cross Country –School had 40 students attend the Family Competition: Grade 7 & 8 Girls' team placed 2nd. 9 students went to the Board finals at Sesquicentennial Park.
- Junior Volleyball- We hosted the Junior Volleyball tournaments. The boy's team fell short of qualifying despite a great effort. The girls advanced to the Family tournament where they continued to demonstrate perseverance and skill, winning the family level. They advanced to the Boards where they very well. We are proud of all their efforts
- Currently intermediate volleyball with mini tournament at St. Jean Brebeuf on November 23
- Eco Initiatives- Pursuing Platinum Certification. Daily announcements to remind students of initiatives, litterless lunches, boomerang lunch, encourage refillable water bottles, seedlings for peace garden, etc.

- Regular health and safety routine checks take place monthly and our school is extremely compliant
- Completed all our fall fire drills and a lock down drill
