## Chair Report – B. Davies and M. Jedrzejczak

#### **Domino's Pizza Fundraiser Update**

• \$70.00 was raised between February and March 2022.

#### **Spring Fundraiser –Big Box of Cards**

- Every morning there is an announcement reminder, the flyer was sent out and the email was sent as well.
- School cash online reads \$35.70 for pricing as the program had the fee built in.

### **Plantables**

• Six orders have been processed to date. An email reminder will be sent out that you can order at any time. Last year we did a total of 28 orders. As the weather starts getting nice, hopefully the orders will increase.

#### Fun Day

- Tentative fun day is June 16<sup>th</sup>, with rain date on June 17<sup>th</sup>.
- Per L. Choporis, from the school perspective it cannot be quite what it was before due to turnaround time and volunteers as not everyone has up to date reference checks. Due to this, Fun Day will have to be onsite at SJB. It will be more like a play day, activities out in the yard, grade 8's can do leadership activities, with music, lunch and an ice cream truck in school yard.
- K. Ciavioliello has been trying to get quotes in background. Ice cream truck quotes were \$2.00 a serving, with option of a small cone (vanilla, chocolate or twist) or a small slushie with all flavours available. With staff estimation is at 375 people at \$750.00 approximate cost for 2 hours, although we are seeing if we can get a the truck for a longer time frame.
- The truck that serves ice cream also has a hot dog and sausage cart as an option. Will compare traditional burger costs through St. Thomas Aquinas vs. the cost of the hot dogs being served with ice cream.
- K. Ciavioliello also looked into the place that Mrs. Giuliano orders school snacks for perhaps sliced apples and cheese string.
- M. Jedrzecjczak suggested as an alternative if we pre-cut our own fruits maybe we can serve more.
- Last time burgers were \$1800.00 for 450 servings, fruit was approximately \$95.00 but food is more expensive. Even at \$2000.00 for food we would likely have \$3000.00 in the account and we have less kids now.
- Looks like we have budget for fruit trays, hot dog and ice cream.
- Kristina has placed a call into Kisko freezies to donate to us as well. So perhaps use this for last week of school. Kristina will get list of ingredients for anything we do get.

- L. Choporis is seeing if the fire truck can come for a few hours.
- May create a smaller Fun Day Breakout Committee.

### **Parent Engagement**

- L. Choporis spoke to two people not obligated to use them but she spoke to someone who focuses on emotional intelligence Leo Barbe- for \$850.00. Determining availability. He said his message is more for grades 5 and up. He can gear it to the lower grades as well. \$1200 approx. plus approx.. \$850.00 for parents.
- Second person, Sarah Westbrook nurturing child wellbeing- was determine during the meeting we had used her once before.
- We will go with Leo Barbe since we have not had the engagement with him prior and see if he can do a JK to 4 and a 5 to 8.

We owe the \$1000 for the grad, and do not believe that we have anything else budgeted out. Even with just grad we have over \$5000 as the \$360 from Dominos has not cleared yet. Tumblebooks was paid for, Sacramental \$300 we will pay, \$500 support to community was already paid. Mrs. Choporis was hoping to book final mass at church for June with shuttle buses, and this is her request, she is figuring out our ratios to see if she has enough volunteers, in past was approximately \$600. With Aussie X there is an outdoor grant that Mrs. Choporis will use which means it no longer runs through parent council. Parent engagement for \$500 went into board budget account so it is already in there -there are two options over \$500. Technology is left – 20 more Chromebooks were ordered which is going through the school budget so we can pause it for now – but if needed will know by June. This now leaves us \$4900 which includes graduation and sacramental, and \$600 with bus brings us to \$4300, plus what we make from Big Box of Cards and the \$360 to be cleared from Pizza so likely will have almost \$5000.
